Leadership Skills

To successfully execute your leadership vision, you must be able to define the vision, strategy, and tactical plan for your organization, and then effectively communicate it to your team in a way that engages and focuses them around a common goal.

3 Tips on Leadership Vision

- Define and Communicate Vision A vision brings a team together under a common goal so that your team is not simply working, but is working together to create something that moves you closer to your leadership vision.
- Think Strategically Your strategy defines how you will achieve your leadership vision based on a number of internal and external factors.
- Plan and Prioritize Formulate objectives and priorities, implement and monitor plans in alignment with the long-term strategy of the organization.

- Vision provides focus
- Vision helps to keep us moving forward and move through obstacles.

Food Strategies

What crop is both a fiber crop and a food crop?

Cotton

Texas leads the U.S. in cotton production and it is our leading cash crop, ranking only behind the beef and nursery industries in total cash receipts. Texas annually produces about 25% of the entire U.S. crop and plants over 6 million acres! That's over 9,000 square miles of cotton fields.

- Cotton is the No. 1 cash crop on the High Plains of Texas.
- One bale of cotton weighs about 500 pounds.
- It takes less than a half-pound of cotton to make a large T-shirt.
- United States paper currency is made of 75% cotton and 25% linen. So, your money has cotton in it, too!
- An average High Plains cotton crop is enough to make almost a billion pairs of jeans or 1.738 billion men's sports shirts! That's enough to make sure everyone in the United States has at least two pairs of jeans!
